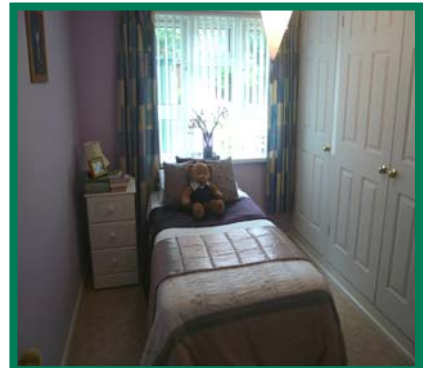

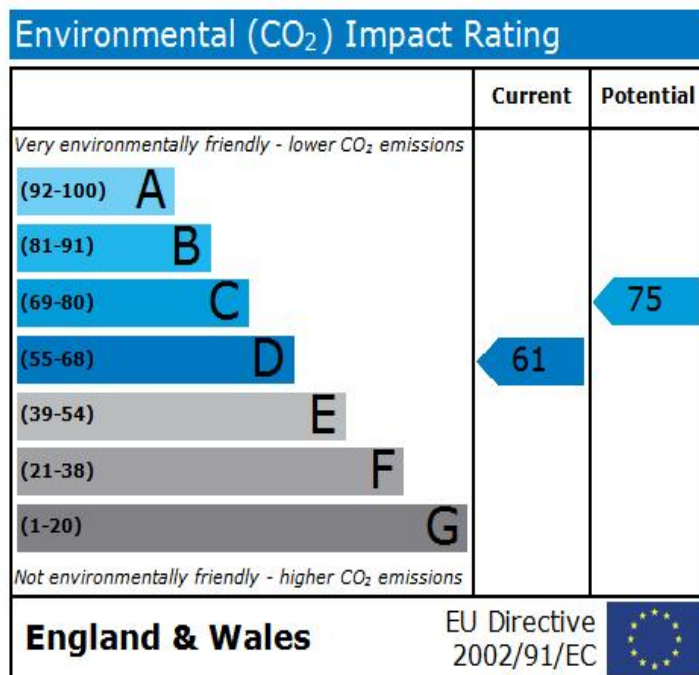
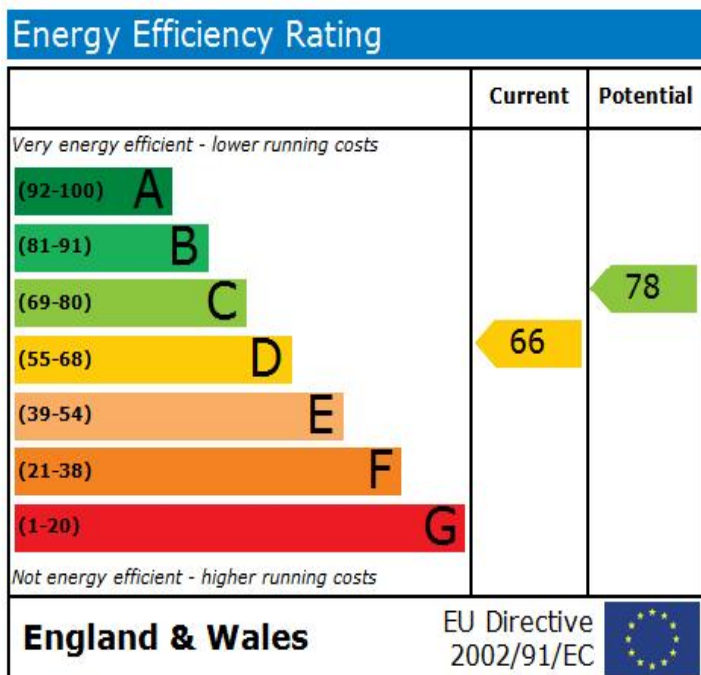

Bathroom



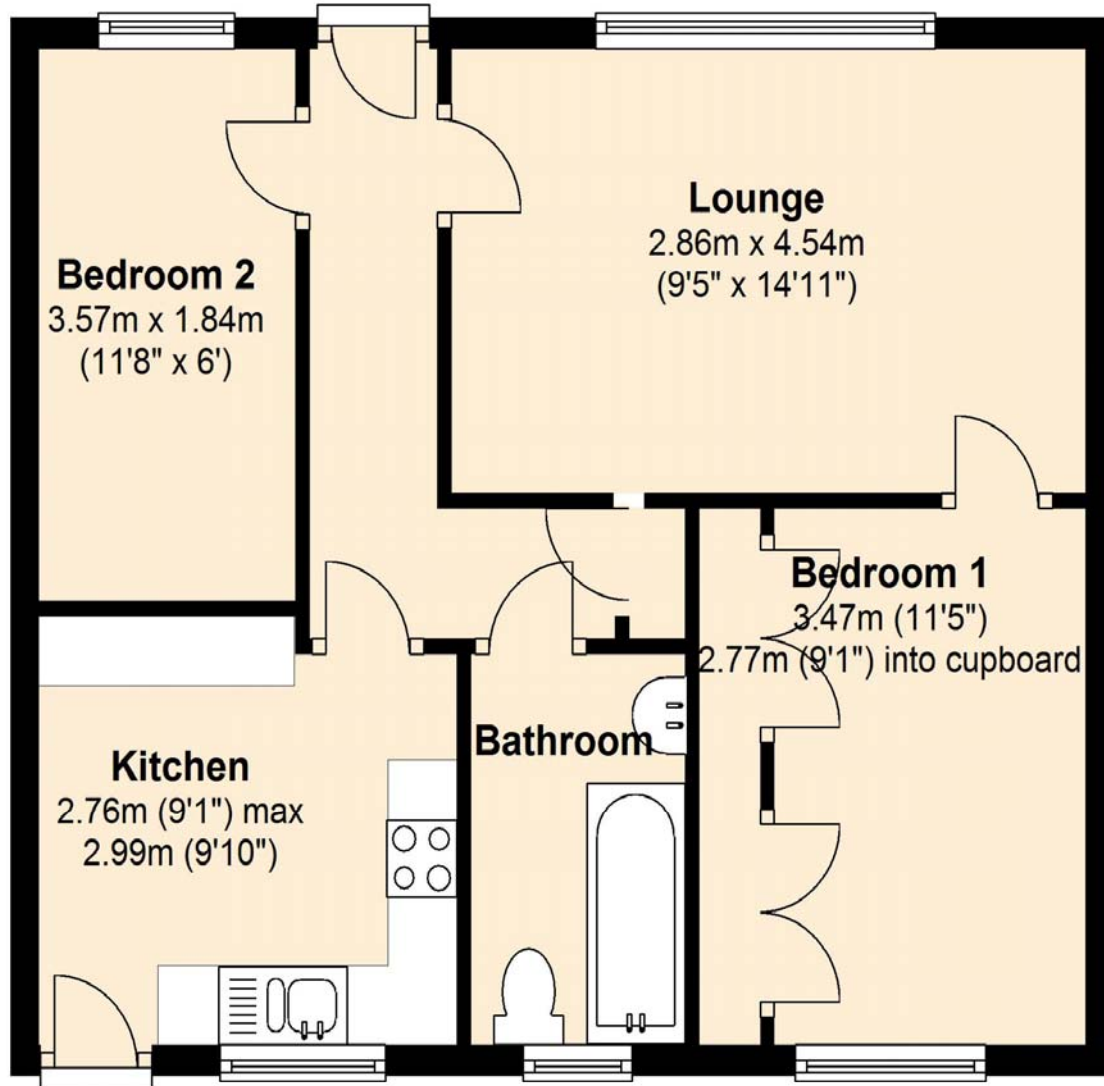
Garden
